

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I don't know if it is just me or if it is something the rest of you wrestle with, but my problem is the urge just constantly to look forward to "the next big thing."

Christmas, in all its glory and splendor, has come and gone. Now all the planning of Lent and the knowing that the weight and work that are to come to make the Lenten season meaningful spiritually begins to grow heavy. With so much to do in the near future, it seems irresponsible not to give Lent our focus and time. Despite the sense of that notion, I think it is a disservice to our spiritual lives to jump to Lent too quickly.

We are currently in the season of "Epiphanytide," or the less cool name, "The season after Epiphany." Epiphany means "manifestation" or "appearance." It is the appearance of Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior of the entire world. As such, these weeks between such monumental events, that is, Christmas and Lent, should be honored in their own right. The Gospel lessons we have had since the beginning of Epiphanytide reveal to us the nature and mission of Jesus. We see the power of Jesus and of what He calls His disciples and us to do and be. On the 29th, we have a perfect example of this. On the fourth Sunday after Epiphany, we have Jesus giving us the "Beatitudes," some of the most well-known and powerful yet difficult teachings of Christ. In it, everything we know of the world is reversed. In it, those who are the least of the world and those who suffer the most are lifted by Him who is the Most High. It is lessons like these, these powerful truths of who our Lord is and what it means to be a Christian, that are lost if we are already focused on Lent.

My challenge to myself and to you all is to slow down. Do not let the world or the worries or stress of what is to come stop you from living in the *now*. If we become blinded by the concerns of tomorrow, we will not see Christ revealed to us in today. Let us all seek to look for Jesus working in our lives every day. For it is in the everyday seeking of Christ that we can be His disciples who continue the mission of defying the sin of the world and bringing the grace of Christ to all people.



This Lent, we will be gathering with the other Episcopal churches in Goldsboro and our partner Holy Innocents. Each Wednesday night in Lent, we will come together to

worship, break bread, and seek to grow in our understanding of God. In the program, we will dive deeply into what the days of Holy Week are.
