Lenten Spikes, 2022

For 20 to 25 years John Barnett, William (Will) Walker and I devoted a week during the warm weather months to some high-class loafing: We floated a portion of Virginia's James River between Lynchburg and Richmond. Some years the fishing was good, the campsites were beautiful, and the conversations were excellent; some years things were not perhaps so great, but they make wonderful memories all the same.

In every case John and Will, good photographers with good equipment, kept a pictorial record of the trip. The best I could do was to keep an onthe-spot, at-the-moment journal of events as the watery miles drifted by.

Once back home we three polished up our notes and exchanged copies, proof to our children and grandchildren that we were young men once. Now Will, who never married, is dead. John and I, now brothers-in-law, will soon be 79 years old.


For our August 1992 trip, the water was a little low and clear as gin. Just upstream of the old Six-Mile railroad bridge and a few miles downstream of Lynchburg, I was idly looking at rocks on the bottom when I saw a step-ladder-like pattern of something two or three feet down. Anchoring the canoe, I slipped into the river, feeling this "ladder," first with my feet and then with my hands. The timbers were too big and heavy for me to move them, but several times I felt small, linear objects which I could recover. These objects proved to be metal spikes, bent and twisted, but a few were still reasonably straight—old trestle spikes, obviously hand-forged.

In May 1864, Union General David Hunter, on orders from General Grant, marched his men south from Cedar Creek near Winchester into the Shenandoah Valley, destroying anything of value to Confederate forces. River and railroad transportation facilities in Lynchburg were an obvious target. Hunter did a good (?) job; among many other things he burned this railroad trestle, which was never rebuilt on the same site.

According to the December 2017 National Geographic magazine, Roman crucifixions took many forms. Iron nails were rare and valued, so the Romans used ropes more often than nails. And the term "nail" evidently had a different meaning from that which we now ascribe to it. In a photograph from the magazine of a crucified man's heel bone found in a family tomb, the "nail" closely resembles the trestle spikes which I pulled from the James River.

And so, with Lent upon us, perhaps it is appropriate that my James River trestle spikes hang on the church doors. They are a visible, tangible symbol of why we celebrate the season.
