Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Alleluia! Christ is risen. The Lord is risen indeed! Alleluia! These are the joyful words we have been proclaiming at the beginning of our communal worship since the glorious Easter Day; I also pray that you have been proclaiming it in your soul and actions as we continue to celebrate this Eastertide. In our world, it is easy to see the joy and power of Easter as solely a day. For a lot of people, Easter is over, and they're back to normal. Our tradition, however, and many others, holds that the joy of Easter is a *season*, and as such, we, in the past few weeks and in the weeks to come, will continue to marvel and be thankful for the glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ.

As disciples of the Risen Christ, we are all called to a life of service to others and devotion in worship and learning of our faith in our Triune God. One of the aspects that is so powerful about our Lord Jesus' resurrection is that it has changed everything. We are not called to be just as we are; through the freedom of Christ, we are able to follow in His footsteps, to take up our own crosses, and labor just as He and the Apostles did. When I think of Jesus' death and resurrection, I always think of what it must have been like for Mary Magdalene to be the first to witness the resurrected Christ. Mary Magdalene sadly does not get as much written about her as others in the Gospels, but that does not mean she is not a wonderful example for us. What are we, who come face to face with the Risen Christ each week in the Blessed Sacrament, called to go out and do? What are you being called to take on in service to our Risen Lord? I can assure you there are ample opportunities.

People are always welcome to get involved in our corporate worship on Sundays; consider if you are called to be a reader or to serve around the altar, it is a great way to get a hands-on understanding of what goes on in our liturgies. Are you being called to deepen your faith and your understanding of it? Consider joining those of us who gather for a Christian formation every Tuesday, or the Zoom book study of *Mere Christianity* beginning on May 4th. Are you being particularly called to the service of others? Countless organizations do all different types of work for the service of others. We have some opportunities for outreach coming up, so please plan on being involved in those. Maybe you are being called with an idea of how we, as a parish, can better serve our community! Please do not keep the idea to yourself; meet with either me or a member of the vestry and let us know. Ideas are always wonderful; maybe you are called to spearhead that idea or a new ministry; once someone starts something, people are quick to join, so I can assure you that you will not be alone.

The work of being a disciple of Christ is never ending; we are all called in a variety of ways. God has given each one of us talent and gifts that can be used for His service and glory, so let us in the joy of Easter not look at the work ahead of us as a chore but as an opportunity to joyously proclaim that Jesus is alive and active



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am thrilled to say that beginning on May 4th at 7 pm, the congregations of St. Andrews, Holy Innocents, St. Francis, and St. Stephens are invited to join on Zoom for a book study. In an 8-week study, we will break down Mere Christianity by C.S Lewis. Lewis is one of the most well-known Anglican authors; he is known for The Chronicles of Narnia but is also a well-respected and influential theologian. Lewis' impact on Christian theology and understanding is among, in my opinion, one of the greatest of the 20th century. Lewis wonderfully blends a simple, straightforward way of right with a deep and intellectual faith. Lewis and his ideas and teachings on Christianity are accessible to anyone who is willing to sit down and be intentional about their faith, so fear not if this is your first foray into understanding our faith.

So why should you be excited about Mere Christianity? This book provides concrete and logical evidence and an understanding of why Christianity is true. It isn't simply a book on apologetics but a desire to understand why Christianity is true and what that means for those claiming to be Jesus Christ's disciples. In the book, we will be discussing Christian ethics and what is right and wrong, the necessity of free will, and the existence of evil in our world. This book covers many of the questions people have about Christianity. I pray that studying and discussing Mere Christianity will be a time for us to grow closer together as brothers and sisters in Christ and embolden us to go out into the world to serve others as disciples of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

month who have been screened and referred by state or federal social service agencies in Carteret County. The goal is to tie the families over during a temporary financial crisis or while they are awaiting permanent assistance.




