The phrase "the people are the church, not the building" drives me up a wall. Yes, it has a technical truth to it, but the implications are egregiously overblown. Now I know what some are already saying: "Of course you disagree; you're a priest it benefits you to have people in the pews." Again, that has some technical truths but is a gross oversimplification. As a priest, my strongest desire and the point of my vocation is through word and Sacraments to bring people into a relationship with God. As such, wanting people to go to a Church every Sunday is not some self-gratifying point but a desire out of Christian love, a love that wants the best for someone, which can only be found through a personal relationship with the Heavenly Father and with fully engaging in the Christian life.

So then, why is the church as the building and the gathering place of worship important? Why have people sunk re-

So then, why is the church as the building and the gathering place of worship important? Why have people sunk resources into beautifying buildings and ground for thousands of years, or have them set aside as places dedicated to a worshipping community? Well, the Old Testament is filled with stories of God wanting the Israelites to set apart a place for their worship and to commune with Him. Even when they were in the desert, God instructed them to build a tabernacle to be their place set aside. Look at the example of Jesus Christ Himself; God incarnate in the flesh regularly attended synagogue, or as the Gospels state about His attendance, that going to the synagogue was "His custom." Jesus Himself also in the Gospels states the Apostle Peter was trusted to be the founding rock of His Church. Jesus intentionally intended that those who would follow Him be engaged with the greater community of believers and come together for fellowship and worship. I could go on and on with references in Holy Scripture that make it clear that the Christian life is intended to be done together with the church at the heart of their gathering and going out.

When we stop and think about it, it does make sense. Humans have forever been a communal and sociable species. We were created in the image of God, and He intended for us to have a relationship with Him and each other. We build our churches and keep our grounds beautiful because, as houses of worship, they reflect what we understand of God. Churches are built in many different shapes and sizes, emphasizing different aspects of our God. The vast and high-vaulted cathedrals show the splendor and majesty of God in His Kingship of all the universe. Small wooden Churches can reflect the beauty in the simplicity of natural creation and the close, intimate relationship a Christian is to have with God. Regularly, churches are criticized for using money on beautiful buildings and grounds. People say that the money could be used to feed the poor; again, there is a technical truth, but the implications do not tell the whole story. We can have beautiful Churches and feed and care for the needy. It doesn't have to be an either-or.


So let us thank God that we have beautiful churches where the weary and downtrodden can have real experiences of God's love for them. Let us give thanks that we have communal houses of worship in which we can join together to see our Lord Jesus Christ alive on our altar and thousands of others. Let us thank God that these places of worship serve as the gathering place for a community of believers to love and support one another and to be the hub

from which we go to serve God's people. With all of that, let us pray that all persons on Earth may find a church in which they may feel the love of God and know Him in their hearts and minds through the worship of Him and His love of them revealed in the Sacraments.

 We'll have food trucks with food available for purchase and family-friendly interactive festival offerings throughout the day (music, speakers, activities, and more!)


