One of the things I love the most about our Episcopal tradition is that we all get to engage in our worship of the Lord. We as a community all join together and take part in our liturgy. In the more charismatic traditions, worship tends to be led by either a singular person or a small group. In other liturgical traditions, the liturgy can tend to focus on the officiant as a sort of intercessor for the people to God. While these are fine and work for some people, I have always liked being more involved in the Liturgy.

We come together as a congregation that prays certain prayers affirming our beliefs or recalling the presence of Christ among us. We join our voices to sing songs of praise or recite canticles and Psalms as devotion to God. It is a communal effort that takes all of us to make worship so powerful.

Another aspect that I find so powerful of our tradition is the number of lay people involved. I think something we continually take for granted is the level lay people are able to be involved in our tradition. Lay people can read and proclaim the word of God as an intricate part of our worship. Lay people can assist at the altar; they can help prepare the table of God as we celebrate Christ being present among us in the Eucharist. Lay people assist in serving the Blessed elements of the Body or Blood of our Savior. These are just a few examples of the powerful ways lay people are empowered to be the hands and feet of Christ in our community.

I hope we all will pray and ask God to show us new ways we can serve the people in our community and in our Church. I invite everyone to discern whether you are called to serve in a new way in Church. I understand that being involved in the liturgy can be intimidating, but I promise you will find it easier than you expect and more fulfilling than you can possibly imagine. So please feel

free to talk with me, and I guarantee we can find a way for you to meaningfully become more engaged in our worship of our Lord God.


The St. Francis ECW has had a busy summer: We helped with these projects:


