Among our lovely British transplants is Brenda Chambers, long-time member of St. Francis. Born in Kings Lynn, Norfolk, England, Brenda attended Gaywood Park School. She met Charles "Chuck" Chambers in Kings Lynn when he was stationed there as a radar navigator on B52s with the Air force. They married in December 1957 and moved to the States to their first base in Little Rock, AK, where their daughter Susanne was born.

They had several TDYs to KA and CA, a state which they loved. They spent five years in Grand Forks, ND, and enjoyed traveling to Canada, British Columbia, and other places in the area.

In 1968-69, they were stationed in Puerto Rico at Ramey AFB. Brenda spoke fondly of the lime trees, gardens, and goats in the classroom at her son Paul's preschool (Paul was born in Little Rock in 1963). Susanne loved riding horses here. Now a nursing facilitator, she has been a nurse at Viadant in Greenville for thirty-five years.

When the Air Force sent the family to Seymour Johnson AFB in Goldsboro near the end of the Vietnam War, Chuck flew in B52s that bombed Hanoi. The Air Force lost several B52s, but Chuck flew with an experienced pilot who knew how to keep his plane safe.

After twenty-two years in the Air Force, Chuck retired as a Lieutenant Colonel in 1973. They settled in Goldsboro, and a neighbor told them about St. Francis which they joined in 1993. Paul served as acolyte, and now he, too, is retired from the Air Force after twenty-eight years of service.

Brenda has enjoyed traveling all over Europe, especially in Spain where Paul and his family live. His wife is a teacher with the Department of Defense, and they have two girls.

Brenda has four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. She rode a camel in Morocco with Paul and his family, and she has worked as a volunteer at the base and has been an active member of the Episcopal Churchwomen. She said, "I have had a wonderful life!"

NOTE: PROJECTS LISTED BELOW ARE NOT SCHEDULED TO BE COMPLETED UNTIL IT IS SAFE. Purchased 3 more security cameras, need to be installed.

Need to purchase and put up 2 handicap signs and restripe parking area (Have stencil, the signs have been ordered, will install ASAP).

Dead bolts need to be installed in the kitchen and in the storage room.

Need to get an estimate to have the walkway roof replaced.

New lawn tractor has been repaired. Cost was \$303. Mitch Baker has donated \$150.00 towards the cost of repair. Thanks to Al Elmore for arranging to have it repaired. The old tractor will not start. It needs a new battery. I did not purchase one because we do not use it.

If we start using the church or parish hall cleaning supplies will have to be purchased & cleaning teams will have to be set up or we will need to hire an outside service to sanitize per CDC guidelines. We will need to follow the guidelines as posted by the Bishop and the Federal /Local Government.

For outside church services we may need to purchase a sound system to use in the parking lot. There is a lot of new technology for transmission. FM has been used for years, estimated cost is around \$500.00. New Wifi technology, do not know cost, AM System is also new; cost will be available in October.

Reminder: we need to keep the church grounds neat during this pandemic. If anyone has free time, we need help to blowing off the parking lot and sidewalk, pick up pinecones and debris also mow the areas that our lawn care person does not mow. Just come to the church when you have time and go to work.

### **Farm Credit Farmers Market**


